Literacy



Thanks to all who attended our EL Curriculum Night! It was a success and students enjoyed sharing what they are learning in literacy. This month students will continue Module 3: Exploring Literary Classics. The guiding questions for this unit are "How do writers capture a reader's imagination?" and "What can we learn from reading literary classics?" Students will continue reading Peter Pan They will determine how illustrations contribute to the text and analyze character actions, motivations, point-of-view, and traits. Students will also examine how each chapter builds on the previous chapter and analyze how historical events in Great Britain impacted the text. Students will also begin writing a book review.



Students will review math topics for Cycle 2 and take our Cycle 3 assessment. Students will begin our fractions unit this month. They will learn how to represent fractions with area models and number lines as well as use models and number lines to show equivalent fractions.



Social Studies/Science



In Social Studies we will begin our history unit. Students will learn about historical events and analyze the impact of contributions made by diverse historical figures in our local community and regions over time. They will also explain change over time and multiple perspectives through historical narratives.
